

SUPPORT GROUPS - PASSAGES HOME - PASSAGES **CHICO:** IN THE EARLY MORNING HOURS of December 11, 2024, fire destroyed Bidwell Mansion, the home of Chico's founder John Bidwell and his wife, Annie.

Although the mansion was totally engulfed, the Visitor's Center survived and, miraculously, so did the Architect's House, the small brick building behind the mansion built for San Francisco based architect Henry Cleveland when he began planning the mansion – (seen in the far right of this photo). This building served as his home away from home and as his office to conduct the business of building such a grand mansion in the middle of a farming town.

Attached to the architect's house is a carriage shed, a modern structure built on the footprint of the original. It also survived the fire as did the original carriages used by the Bidwells which are inside. Just behind the carriage house are the original steps that were constructed for Annie Bidwell, allowing the petite woman to board carriages and ride horses.

REBUILDING JOHN AND ANNIE BIDWELL'S CARRIAGE SHED – 1986-1989.

On January 28, 1986, the *Chico Enterprise-Record* ran a plea:

Do you recall the Bidwell carriage house?

The Bidwell Mansion staff is looking for photos of the carriage shed which once housed [buggies] belonging to John and Annie Bidwell. Once it can be determined what the shed looked like, it will be reproduced next to the mansion to display several of the family's carriages. ...

On April 28th of the following year, the Chico Enterprise-Record ran:

1920's addition comes down.

Friday, workers tore down the old CSU offices built in the 1920's at the back of Bidwell Mansion. This was the second phase of the rebuilding of John and Annie Bidwell's carriage shed to the north of the mansion. Earlier

this year, Chico State University anthropology students, directed by professor Keith Johnson, conducted on-the-spot research to find the original cement foundations of the original carriage shed, partially covered by the additions. Plans are to erect a building to house the mansion's collection of horse-drawn carriages.

From the Chico Enterprise-Record of October 22, 1988:

Tuesday, as workers moved in the heavy equipment to begin ground work for the rebuilding of a carriage house at Bidwell Mansion, several longtime supporters of Bidwell Mansion were on hand including Icel Beers (left to right), Ted Meriam, and Crystal Trott. As mansion ranger, Paul Holman is overseeing the reconstruction of the Bidwell-era structure. Tim Simonds (far right), is the general contractor. The carriage house, torn down in the 1920's by Chico State University, was used to store Bidwell carriages. When completed, it will hold five carriages.

Once again, the carriage shed at Bidwell Mansion is home to several buggies and carriages of Bidwellera vintage. Supervising ranger Paul Holman helps to maintain them. Saturday, the Bidwell Mansion Association and Las Senoras will make the new structure official during a dedication beginning at 11:15 a.m. ... The carriage house, a reconstruction built over the location of the original structure, has been funded by the association, Las Senoras, Native Daughters of the Golden West, the state and citizen donations.



CARRIAGE SHED DEDICATION — SATURDAY, APRIL 22

A gala event is being planned for the dedication of the Bidwell Mansion Carriage Shed on Saturday, April 22. Musical entertainment along with a Western Barbecue will be part of the activities for the 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. activity.



Pictured at left is one of General and Mrs. Bidwell's carriages that will be housed and available for viewing in the newly completed carriage shed. Pat Phelps of Orland has assisted the Bidwell Mansion Association in getting one of the carriages completely restored. He is now in the process of restoring a Tank Wagon that was used in farming on the Patrick Ranch south of Chico. Mrs. Hester Patrick has been a true benefactor in assisting the **Bidwell Mansion Association** and is the donor of the Tank Wagon. She has also provided

storage space for other horse drawn vehicles of the Bidwell's before and after their restoration.

The new shed will house four Bidwell Buggies and a Tank Wagon, all of which will have been restored when placed in the new building. So far as is known, the new building is on the site where a former shed once stood during the time of the Bidwells. A plaque is now being prepared which will be placed at the north end of the new shed to express appreciation to the several organizations who have contributed to its restoration.

Dedication ceremonies will begin at 11:15 a.m. in front of the Carriage Shed at the Northwest corner of Bidwell Mansion. At press time final arrangements are still being made for musical entertainment with a square dance performing group, old time fiddling and/or a barber shop quartet. Henry R. Agonia, Director, California Department Parks and Recreation will be present along with other State Officials. General Bidwell and Mrs. Bidwell (a.k.a. Chip Meriam and Cathy Mueller) will be present to welcome and mingle with all those gathered for this celebration.






